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IQMR is designed to enable graduate students and junior faculty to create and critique methodologically sophisticated qualitative and multi-method research.

IQMR is an intensive two-week workshop with over 30 faculty teaching diverse qualitative research methods. Methods are taught as individual techniques, and in conjunction with quantitative and experimental approaches as part of multi-method research designs.

Participants learn directly from the authors of leading methods texts on the contributions and challenges of important social science methods.

IQMR includes hands-on, interactive instruction giving attendees the opportunity to try out the methods they are learning.

Attendees present their own research design in dedicated sessions and receive focused and intensive feedback.

Department Nominations:
