


Start with the first program.




Use a push pin to represent the types of stakeholder (e.g., academic, business, etc.). Show these on a color key located on the upper right hand side of your board. Green = Government Blue = Business Purple = Not-for-profit




Each stakeholders relates to each other with a different type of tie. Ties are shown with different colored rubber bands. Use the rubber bands to represent ties in your network. Green=Contractual; Yellow=Interlocal Agreement; Red =Information exchange; Blue = CoLocation




Examples of how stakeholders might be connected to one another. (Directly)




Examples of how stakeholders might be connected to one another. (Indirectly)



You will also want to think about relationships that you would like to establish. For example, Hospital D is in my region is not involved with my program. (Thus there is no rubber band connecting it to my network.)
